Here we will start our Learning Journey with a visit of the **Zuiderzeemuseum**. The Zuiderzeemuseum in Enkhuizen brings stories of the people who once lived on the shores of the Zuiderzee to life. See, hear, feel, taste and smell everyday life round the Zuiderzee as it was before the Afsluitdijk (the great lisselmeer Barrier Dam) turned the former inland sea into the lisselmeer. After our visit of the Zuiderzeemuseum, we will hop on a **sailing yacht**, where we will spend the night roaming the waters of the lisselmeer.

Day 2: Tuesday May 28th



Following our visit, we will head towards **Delft**, where we will have dinner and stay for the night in the authentic city centre.

In the afternoon we will have a break, in which we will race each other in a greenhouse. Are you ready to show that you are our next Max Verstappen?

We will continue our journey at **Koppert Cress**, which as an assortment of **freshly-sprouted cresses** and other edible leaves and flowers, supplying chefs world wide. Following the visit, the **chefs** of Koppert Cress will create a **magical dinner** for all of us. The night of our third day we will spend in **Delft** again.



Arrival information

- Banks main opening hours are from 9:00 to 17:00 Monday to Friday.
- Shops main opening hours are from 9:00-17:00 Monday to Sunday, with some stores being closed on Sunday and Monday mornings.
- In The Netherlands, we pay with the Euro (EUR)



Useful information

Electricity

- In The Netherlands, power plugs and sockets of Type F (standard 2 pin plugs) and type C are used.
- Standard voltage is 230 V at a frequency of 50 Hz.

Weather

• The average daily temperature during the last week of May in The Netherlands is 17°C.
